Reflections regarding the spiritual practice of SILENCE

When Jesus woke up, he rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Silence! Be still!" Suddenly the wind stopped, and there was a great calm. Mark 4:39

Silence is God's first language; everything else is a poor translation. Father Thomas Keating



As some of you may know, one of my spiritual disciplines is attending seasonal silent retreats. This past weekend I attended a Centering Prayer Contemplative Outreach silent retreat at Christ the King Retreat Center in Buffalo, MN.

Upon returning from the retreat, I was asked what I did with my time during the retreat. Did I read? I was asked. I had to think for a moment...How did I use my time? For a moment, I felt somewhat inadequate, and then boldly responded. I prayed. In today's fast paced society we regard productivity and results as being evidence of a life well lived. With this in mind, it is not surprising that I was caught in my ego for a moment as I sought to find the words to respond to such a simple question.

I was first introduced to the practice of Centering Prayer in 1993, when completing my deaconess internship at a Lutheran church in Texas. It was a season in my spiritual life when I was seeking a practice to deepen my connection with God. To my surprise, this new learning, many years ago, of the practice of Centering Prayer continues to enhance and deepen my relationship with God even today.

The following are the 4 simple guidelines to Centering Prayer: This method of prayer is both a relationship with God and a discipline to deepen that relationship.

- 1) Choose a sacred word as the symbol of your intention to consent to God's presence and action within.
- 2) Sitting comfortably and with eyes closed, settle briefly and silently introduce the sacred word as the symbol of your consent to God's presence and action within.
- 3) When engaged with your thoughts, return ever-so-gently to the sacred word.
- 4) At the end of the prayer period, remain in silence with eyes closed for a couple of minutes.

If this glimpse of my spiritual practice of silence interests you, I invite you to ask me more. Let's talk. I absolutely love to invite others to join in the adventure of knowing God more intimately, through silence.




